attempt

(verb) To try; to make an effort. *Christina **attempted** to hang a spoon on her nose for a full minute.*

(noun) An effort. *I can't promise that I'll climb over the fence, but I'll make an **attempt**.*

confuse

(verb) To make or become unclear or mixed up in the mind. *Sometimes I get **confused** when I try to think about two things at the same time.*

disaster

(noun) A sudden terrible event that brings about great damage or suffering; a great failure. *One of the biggest natural **disasters** in American history was when Hurricane Katrina hit New Orleans in 2005.*

entertain

(verb) To amuse or make someone have fun. *Lots of kids are **entertained** by cartoons, but Tyrell always found them boring.*



furious

furious

(adj) Very angry. *Our teacher was so **furious** that we hadn't done our homework, he threw an eraser out the window!*

host

(noun) 1. A person who has people over, or who directs the entertainment. *I have no idea who the **host** of the Academy Awards will be this year, but it's usually someone funny.* 2. A large number of something. *Here are a whole **host** of reasons why you shouldn't eat fast food every day.*

(verb) 1. To have people over to your house for a party or event. *Jamie **hosted** a party where everyone had to dress up like animals.*

inspire

(verb) To guide, excite, or encourage. *Latanya didn't like poetry, but she was **inspired** to write some after she climbed a mountain.*

mock

(verb) To make fun of, especially by pretending to be someone. *Gabe frowned and made his voice low, which we all knew was **mocking** our teacher.*

(adj) Fake. *Every year, actors get dressed up like Civil War soldiers and have a **mock** battle to help Americans remember that war.*

pointless

(adj) Having no meaning or effect. *You can try to throw a rock at the moon if you want, but it's **pointless**.*

routine

(noun) 1. Something that is done the same way again and again. *My usual **routine** when I get home from school is to eat two cookies and then go say "hi" to my dog.* 2. An act or skit. *The funniest **routine** I ever saw at a comedy show was when this lady danced with a puppet.*

(adj) Normal; regular. *For me, brushing my teeth every day is **routine**, but taking a shower isn't.*

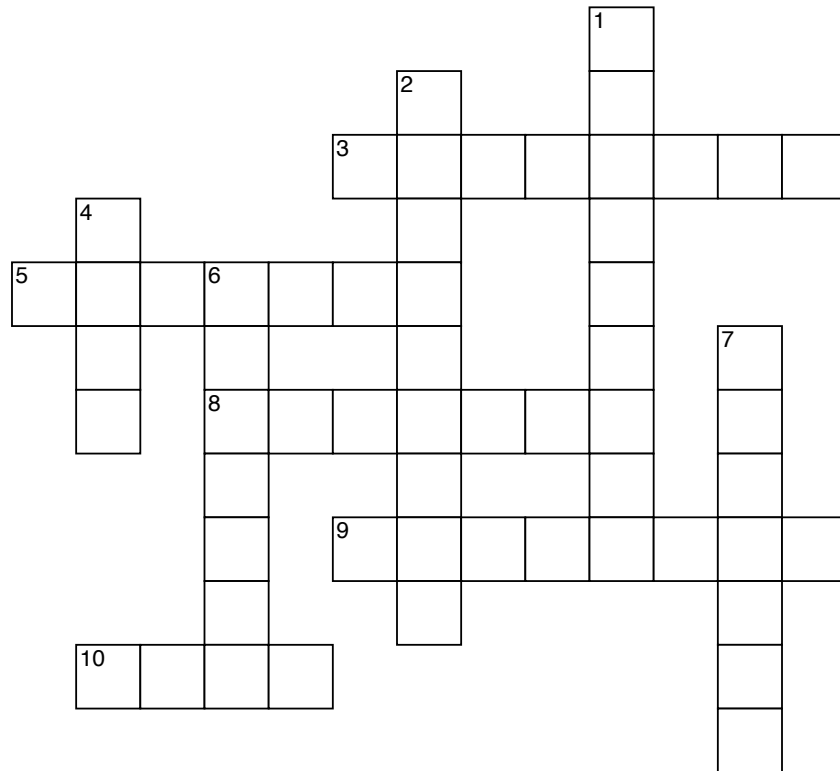
