adopt / arrange / border / deed / fan / flutter / mystify / ordeal / outcome / respect

adopt

(verb). 1. To bring a child into one's home and raise him or her as part of the family. *Franny wasn't born in America, but was **adopted** by her family when she was two.* 2. To take as one's own. *At first he didn't like it, but Karl soon **adopted** his new nickname, "Krazy Karl," and signed it on all his papers.*

arrange

(verb). To put into a certain order. *Manu **arranged** the candies by their color and size.*

border

(noun). The edge that separates one thing from another. *You have to show your passport at the **border** when you pass from the United States into Mexico.*

deed

(noun). Something that is done; an action. *The knight had done many brave **deeds** on his journey, including killing a deadly dragon.*

fan

(noun). 1. A person who supports or roots for someone or something. *At some concerts, the **fans** make so much noise, you can't even hear the music.* 2. Something that spins to move air. *In the summertime, if you don't have an air conditioner, you better go get some **fans**.*

(verb). To move air with a fan or something like it. *It was so hot in church that everyone was **fanning** themselves with pieces of paper to stay cool.*

flutter

(verb). To wave or flap back and forth. *The flag **fluttered** in the wind.*

mystify

(verb). To trick someone and do something they can't understand. *The magician **mystified** all of us when he pulled a snake out of his hat.*



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ordeal

(noun) Something that is very difficult to get through; a test in life. *Having the car stolen was a tough ordeal for the family.*

outcome

(noun) What happens in the end. *Both baseball teams were so good, no one knew what the outcome of the game would be.*

respect

(verb) To have a high opinion of; to look up to. *Everyone in the class really respected the teacher, Ms. Nevins.*

(noun) A feeling that someone or something is great. *I have a lot of respect for people who get rich and then give money to the poor.*

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Amelia Earhart

In 1917, when Amelia Earhart was 20 years old, she saw her first airplane show. Even though there were very few women pilots back then, Amelia knew she wanted to be one. In the next year, she saved enough money to pay for flying lessons and even buy her own plane.

Two years later, she was the first woman to fly 14,000 feet in the air. In 1923, when Amelia was just 26 years old, she became one of the only women in the entire world to have her pilot's license.

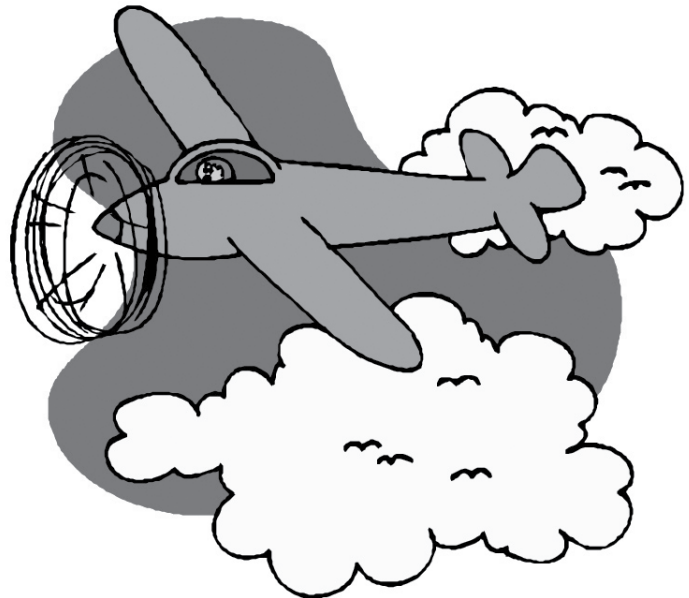
In 1928, Amelia rode in a tiny plane across the Atlantic Ocean. She wasn't the pilot but she was the first woman to ever make that trip. When she returned to the United States, thousands of her **fans** lined the streets of New York City for a parade in her honor. She was even invited to the White House to meet the President.

In 1932, Amelia became the first woman to fly by herself across the Atlantic Ocean. At the very end of the flight, Amelia had to make an emergency landing in a cow field in England. She was found by a farmer, who couldn't believe she had flown all the way from America. After that **ordeal**, President Herbert Hoover gave Amelia a gold medal for her courage. It was the first time a woman had ever won this award.

After that, Amelia decided she wanted to be the first woman to fly all around the world. Amelia set off on June 1, 1937. Amelia and her navigator stopped at the end of each day to rest and get more fuel. On July 2nd, they

took off for a tiny island in the Pacific Ocean. Amelia was having problems with her radio. The U.S. Coast Guard was completely **mystified**. They could not contact Amelia by radio and had no idea where her plane was. But it never reached the island. The **outcome** of Amelia Earhart's crash is still a mystery: Although the U.S. government searched for 13 days, they never found Amelia's plane.

Even though Amelia never finished her trip around the globe, she proved to the country that women should be **respected** just as much as men. And she became a hero for women all over the world.

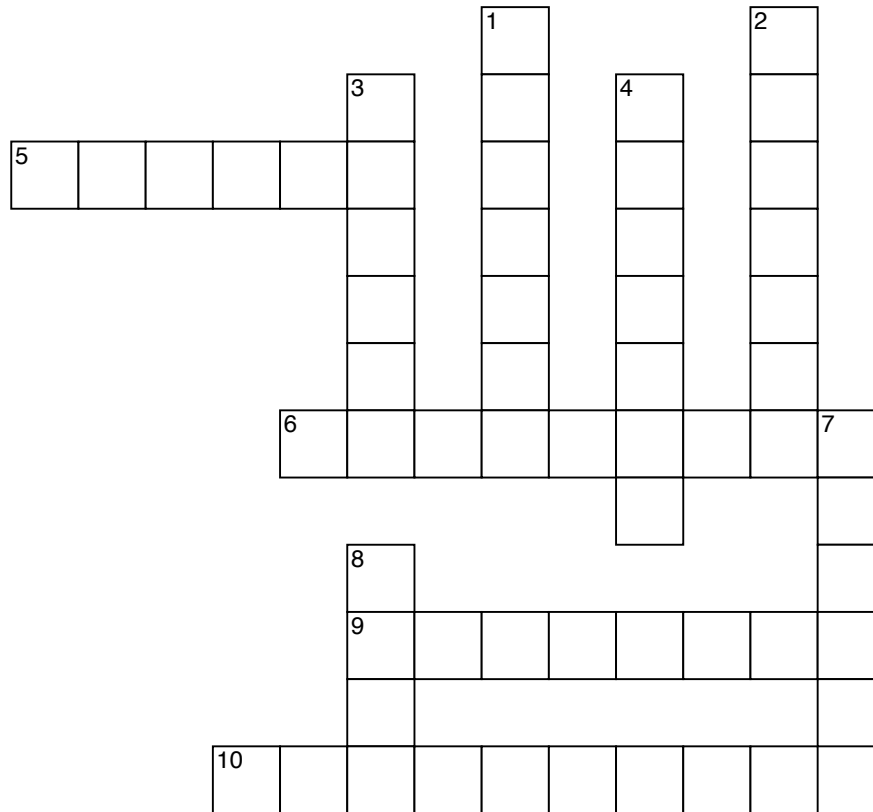
